- Elevated beading techniques, build bead supports and then add lines of beads that are support above the fabric surface creating 3-D beaded patterns.
- Creating a breath-taking beautiful 5-inch beaded kaleidoscope on fabric, using elevated beading skills and new entwined multi-level lines of beads.
- Organic beading stitches including sticky lollipops, beaded coils, and easy beaded cabochon settings.
- A stress-free method of successfully adding beaded text to fabric creations.
- Beaded Sashiko
- Color, value, and scale as they pertain to beading on fabric.
- Enjoyable activities which will nurture and encourage your personal creativity.

Limited to 16 students. Kit fee will also be required (US \$85) including a large quantity of beads, beading threads, needles etc.
