

Poured Acrylic Painting Workshop

In this workshop you will learn the basic skills for doing poured acrylic paintings. This course is for students who want to learn how to create poured acrylic paintings using economic materials using a variety of techniques.

The following is a list of media and materials you will need to do this workshop:

Media:

1. Liquid or full body acrylic paint in a variety of colours. Suggested colours are white, black, red, blue, yellow, orange, green, and purple. Gold and silver are also useful.
2. Elmers white glue. A large bottle will be needed.
4. WD-40 or liquid silicone
3. Gloss acrylic medium or acrylic varnish to finish your paintings once they are dry if you want a glossy finish.

Materials and Tools:

1. 1 package of paper or plastic cups.
2. 3 or more Canvases no larger than 14X16.
3. Plastic to protect the table. Dollar store table clothes work well.
4. Plastic to go under your work. E.g. clear plastic recycle bags you can cut open or green plastic garbage bags.
5. Push pins
6. Spatula, pallet knives, skewers, straws, 2" paint brush, popsicle sticks, acetate sheet if you have one (optional), level if you have one (optional – we can share mine)
7. Apron, latex or rubber gloves, paper towels (this can be messy so wear old clothes).
8. Propane torch available at Canadian Tire. A small kitchen torch works as well. Heat guns DO NOT WORK because they blow air.

Your finished pieces will have to remain at the gallery over night to dry. They will dry dull. If you want a glossy finish you can varnish them once they are dry.
